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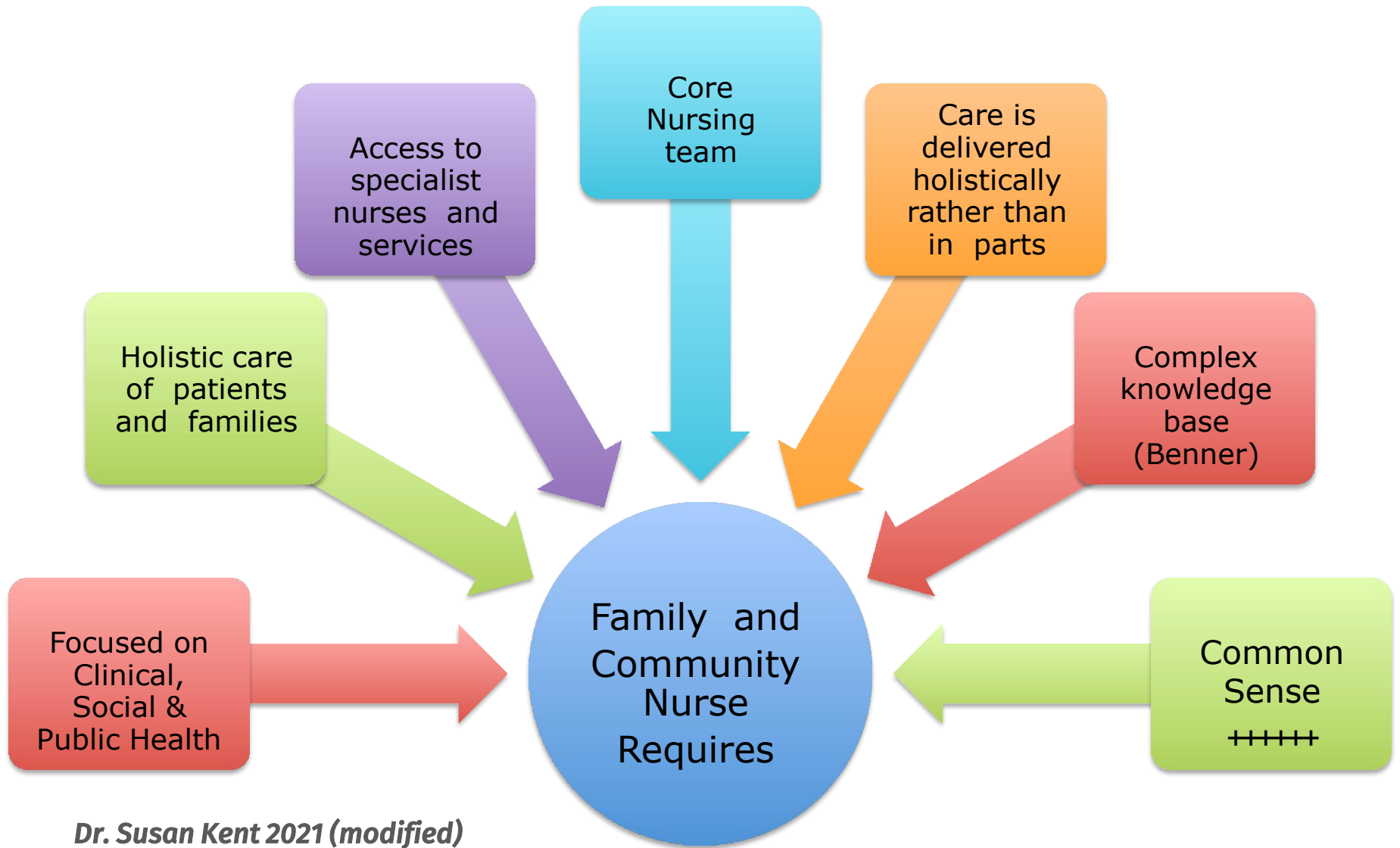
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# Family and Community Nurse

- **Skill, flexibility and respect are the hallmarks of a community-based nurse (Kent 2021)**

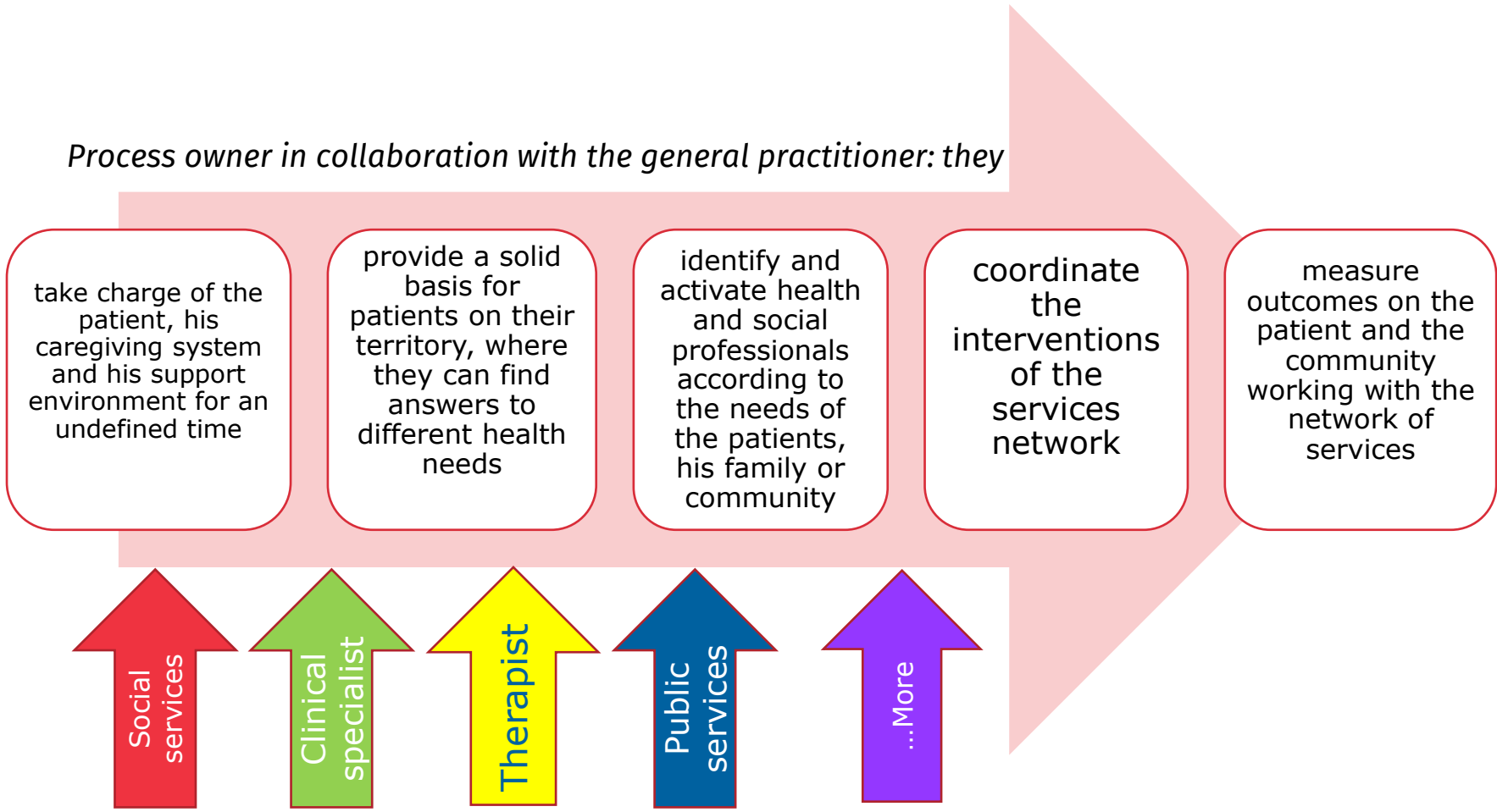

# The changing of a paradigm

Prevention becomes essential in the new model. We move from a "passive" model where, the provision of care takes place only at the moment when the patient is sick, to an "active» model, capable of intervening before the acute event, where we try to prevent the disease or its aggravation, maintaining or improving patients, family and community conditions of fragility.

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
